Wood Frogs (Lithobates sylvaticus) began their annual breeding in area forest vernal pools, and then temperatures plummeted below freezing again. The above photo of two couples and a single male wood frog was taken during the warmth of March 26 in the Petersburgh woods. The status of the fertilized eggs is unknown. Below is another wood frog couple in the position called "amplexus," which is when the male is on the back of the female hugging her tightly.
