'Cats In Class C Bowl

Friday, April 23. This game was played between two evenly matched teams that knocked each other around for the entire game. There were hard hits, missed opportunities, big plays and disappointing fumbles and interceptions throughout the game. Both teams had chances to score while near or inside the opponents 20 yard line but those chances were squandered with penalties, dropped passes and running out of time on the clock.

After a back and forth first quarter where neither team could score, Mechanicville got on the board first in the second quarter on a four yard run. With the two point extra point attempt good, Mechanicville held an 8-0 lead.

HFT got the ball on the kickoff and promptly marched right down the field and scored its own touchdown when Payton Nealon romped in on the ground from 17 yards out. The Wildcats elected to kick the extra point, which Andrew Yeardon made, to send the game into halftime at 8-7.

Nealon scored again in the third quarter on a 13 yard run to give the 'Cats its first lead of the game. Yeardon booted the extra point for the final score of the evening.

HFT had 232 total yards, 223 on the ground. Mechanicville had 200 total yards, 110 in the air. Nealon had 106 yards on 21 runs, Josh Colegrove had 96 on 14 runs. Quarterback Michael D'Agostino threw nine passes, completing one for nine yards.
