# **Plans Are Coming Together**

At the May 13 Berlin Town Board meeting plans for the town's upcoming water tower were presented, with only a few relatively small changes being made by the Board. While it's not a guarantee, the hope is that plans for the tower can be approved and bidding can be completed by the end of the year. The Rensselaer County Department of Health is currently reviewing the plans to this point.

#### **Highway**

The town has not yet received a commitment letter regarding CHIPS money from the Department of Transportation, however a significant increase in funds is expected.

The build date for Berlin's new plow truck has been pushed back to August. It appears the truck was ordered just in time as both materials for the build as well as equipment have seen drastic increases in price. These increase won't have any bearing on Berlin however, as the town's price was locked in when ordered. The hope is the new truck can be ready for this coming winter.

#### Ambulance

Details on the town's new ambulance

are starting to come together. The non profit service will be called Taconic Valley Ambulance. The resolution, letter and a map of the area serviced, which are the three things required from a municipal aspect, have all been completed. A business plan has been started and an attorney has been contacted in order to get the paperwork for a 501c3 filed properly.

#### **Other Notes**

It was suggested that part of the incoming COVID-19 relief money be used toward repairing sidewalks, however rules for what the funds can be used for are strict and it isn't yet clear if sidewalk repairs fall within the guidelines.

The status of the rabies clinic the town was hoping to hold this spring is now unclear. Attempts to reach the veterinarian to be used for the clinic have been unsuccessful.

The transfer station would like to remind residents it will be closed Monday, May 24, for Memorial Day. However, it will be open that Saturday and Sunday. Speaking of Memorial Day, Berlin will be having its parade, and a motion to order new flags to replace damaged and worn flags was approved.




