WASHINGTON, D.C.

Delgado Lauds Broadband Benefit Program

U.S. Representative Antonio Delgado (NY-19) highlighted the launch of the Federal Communications Commission's Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) Program and urged eligible constituents to enroll to receive a discount on their monthly internet bill. Rep. Delgado voted to create the EBB program last year through the passage of the bipartisan Consolidated Appropriations Act.

The EBB Program is a groundbreaking new program that will help economically vulnerable Americans afford their monthly internet bill. The \$3.2 billion program was created as part of the final omnibus appropriations bill in December, and the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) announced that open enrollment in the program will begin today, May 12. The EBB Program will provide struggling families a discount of \$50 on their monthly cost of home internet service. It may also provide an additional subsidy for a computer.

Households interested in learning whether they qualify are encouraged to visit the FCC's new enrollment website — https://getemergencybroadband.org/— and then sign up for the program through their internet service provider.

Help Plant Trees In Shatford Park


