The Specialty Building

Long since abandoned, in rough shape with several safety concerns, village businessman Jasen VonGuinness indicated he hopes to purchase the structure with renovation in mind. He was there to ask the trustees for their support in efforts to obtain grants to help with the project.

At a previous meeting, a village resident expressed concern about the 1,000 gallon underground propane tank outside the Thorpe Block building. One of that building's owners, Jim Martinez, read a statement to the Board in which he said the tank was installed according to code and is protected by four ballards, also prescribed by code. Codes Enforcement Officer Mark Surdam visited the site for an inspection and found no violations. According to Mr. Martinez's statement, this resident now believes parking a car within 10 feet presents an ignition source.

with a current well as a backup alterna- Mr. Martinez also brought up that the owner of a neighboring building has four 120 gallon above ground fuel tanks, indicating that both the required setback from the property line and proper safety guards may not be in place.

Village Man Faces Drug Charges And Extradition

On May 6, the Rensselaer County Sheriff's Office arrested Jonathan P. Welch, 28, of 68 Mechanic Street in the Village of Hoosick Falls

Following several anonymous tips and a six month investigation, a search warrant was signed by Rensselaer County Court Judge Sober. The search warrant was executed and yielded approximately 800 bags of heroin (tested positive for fentanyl), packaging material, surveillance equipment and scales.

Welch was charged with Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 3rd degree, and Criminal Possession of Narcotic Drug (w/intent to sell) 3rd, both B Felonies.

Due to Bail Reform, Welch was released on his own recognizance, to appear in court at a later date.

A subsequent investigation revealed a warrant out of Vermont State Parole. Sheriff's Investigators arrested Welch at his residence on May 13, where he was remanded to the Rensselaer County Jail, awaiting an extradition hearing.
