Young Man Slain In Overnight Shooting *Troopers Say the Victim Was Targeted*

Just before 4 am on Wednesday morning, June 9, State Police and medical personnel were called to 151 Jay Herrington Road in the northern part of Pittstown to investigate a home invasion. According to the preliminary investigation, it was determined the occupants of the residence woke up to find multiple suspects attempting to force their way into the home. During the incident, 19-year old Nathan M. Miller suffered a fatal gunshot wound.

According to the Robert Appleton of the NYS Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) it is believed three suspect were involved, and following the shooting ran off into a wooded area behind the residence.

Troopers describe the investigation as active and say preliminary information suggests this was a targeted shooting and that the parties involved knew one another. There is not believed to be an ongoing threat to the community. State police are asking anyone who may have information regarding this investigation to contact

Planning Board Listens To Amazon Concerns

The Schodack Planning Board had a full schedule on June 7 with lot line adjustments and setting up a June 21 public hearing for a ground mount solar project on Jensis Road. However, the bulk of the meeting focused on the public hearing on the new "middle mile" distribution center that Amazon wishes to set up near the intersection of Route 150 and Columbia Turnpike.

The meeting began with the public hearing on the Route 9 Commercial Business Park, approximately 4000 feet to the North of the first Amazon complex. This Park will be the new home of Trojan Energy and Dibble Equipment, along with a 3-lot subdivision.

Delgado Honors Those Who Served At The Capital

Congressional Representative Antonio Delgado was at the Armory in Hoosick Falls Tuesday evening, June 8 for an in person Town Hall meeting, something he has done 58 times during his tenure in office (including 20 virtually during the height of the pandemic). Prior to the Town Hall, the Congressman presented flags to three Rensselaer County National Guard members, Captain Maurice Catel of Wynantskill, Staff Sergeant Ryan Sams of Berlin and Staff Sergeant Michelle Bradley of Melrose who were stationed in Washington, D.C. to protect the Capitol building following the insurrection on January 6. While in Washington, the Congressman visited and thanked the New York National Guard members. During his Town Hall the Congressman also thanked the Hoosick Falls Community and all of Rensselaer County for supporting these service men and women and their families, while stationed in Washington.

In his opening remarks, Representative Delgado highlighted his successful legislative track record during Republican and Democratic administrations, his focus on local
