Special recognition was given to Briggs, McCrea Burnham (NYS Dept of Environmental Conservation for guidance on the trail route and regulations), Rensselaer Land Trust- RPA Volunteer Trail Crew (for their hard work), Warren W. Fane Inc (for donating gravel and loaning equipment), Callanan Industries Inc. (donation of stone dust), Jim Slavin (donation of materials to complete boardwalk over wetland), Ingrid Effman (donating a sitting bench in memory of her father, John W. Solomon), and Lee King (donation of an upcycled church pew bench and the creation of an accessible picnic table at the end of the trail).

Dorothy's Trail is the first of its kind for the community forest. This is the RPA's first equal access (ADA Compliant) trail, planned and built by Jeff Briggs, PCF Steward, and other key volunteers. The trail, completed in Fall 2020, was made in honor of Briggs' mother, Dorothy, who relied on a wheelchair during the later part of her life. It was difficult for Briggs to be out and about with his mom because there were few places that they could enjoy the outdoors with her being wheelchair bound.

Briggs educated himself on the requirements needed to create an accessible trail that was compliant with the Americans With Disabilities Act and began

Once the evergreen bough was cut, seniors and BCS residents ventured onto the stone dust path, crossed the wooden bridge and ventured near the accessible picnic table to take in the wetlands. Along the trail, visitors can read informational signage provided by the Poestenkill Community Library and can even search for tiny garden gnome homes along the forest land.
