## **Vision Becoming Reality**

Not too long ago 18 four foot long commercial planters were installed on the Shop Bridge. They're colored to blend in with the bridge itself. On Friday, May 28, members of Hoosick Rising filled those planters with soil, 60 geraniums and a variety of other flowering and cascading plants. The goal is to eventually have the cascading plants mimic those at the Bridge of Flowers in Shelburne, MA. This project has been two years in the making. Funds for the planters came from the Edith Craig Reynolds and the Harry Weir Trust Foundations. The soil was donated by the Bacon family. The flowers were purchased with funds from the tip jar at Hoosick Provisions. From the start employees determined they wanted those tips to go toward community projects.

In addition to the planters, Hoosick Rising is working with the Town of Hoosick Historical Society to erect a storyboard at the bridge with pictures of what the scene looked like in about 1904, when if you gazed across the bridge, you would have seen the mammoth Walter A Wood factory.

# **Other Hoosick Rising Projects**

Hoosick Rising, with about 40 members, doesn't take time to rest on its laurels. Other projects underway include a map kiosk on Route 22, just off Route 7, a reprint of the current townwide map that it first printed three years ago and more work with the Historical Society to place historic markers throughout the village.

Except for the Board, members have not met during COVID. Quarterly newsletter updates keep everyone informed. A June in person meeting is in the works. Speaking of work, each person must participate in at least one Hoosick Rising activity a year to be a member.

And Hoosick Provisions' employees continue to make good use of that tip jar. In the past they have donated to HACA and purchased new Holiday decorations for the Village. Now the funds are earmarked for Civicure to be used toward the renovation of the Opera House in the Wood Block building.
