Chief Ashe Resigns and Pleads Guilty to Misconduct

Former Hoosick Falls Village Police Chief Robert (Bob) Ashe was arrested by NYS Police on Monday, May 16, and accused of Official Misconduct. He pled guilty that evening in Village Court to the charge, a misdemeanor. Village Court Judge Thomas Restino gave the former chief an unconditional discharge and ordered him to pay a \$205 court surcharge.

Mr. Ashe's conviction would have automatically resulted in his termination and removal from public office, however, he officially resigned his position the previous Friday.

According to the NYS Police press release, the investigation revealed the former chief stole evidence and then created paperwork to cover up the theft. Columbia County District Attorney Paul Czajka was appointed the special prosecutor in the investigation by Rensselaer County Court Judge Jennifer Sober.

Mr. Ashe has been on paid suspension since December of last year, after it was reveal NYS Police were looking into his alleged participation in a potential voter fraud case concerning last November's general election. Hoosick Falls Mayor Rob Allen announced the resignation on Monday morning, saying "We wish him the best of luck with his future endeavors." The Mayor added, "Our Village Police Officers stepped up and served with distinction and honor over the past several months. We are deeply appreciative of their efforts and dedication. Officerin-Charge Paul Aleksonis will continue to lead the Village of

Hoosick Falls Police Department while they provide their essential service to the Village of Hoosick Falls." Mayor Allen indicated the Village would have no further comment at this time. It has not yet been announced when a successor to the former chief will be named, or if any other options are on the table.

Mr. Ashe has been active in law enforcement for 44 years, leading the Hoosick Falls department for the last 18. One of his recent accomplishments was enticing Unity House, a human service agency based in Troy, to open a location in the Village.

BERLIN SCHOOL DISTRICT **Budget Receives Voters' Blessing**

The Berlin School District \$25.9 million budget was approved Tuesday, May 17 by a 214 to 100 vote margin, or 68% of the ballots cast. The purchase of three new 66-passenger school buses also garnered more than enough yes votes. There was a four person race for the three seats open on the School Board. Incumbent Sherry Bowman-Kluck was re-elected with 226 votes. Newcomers Andrea Beckwith received 245 votes while Kimberly Collin tallied 217. Incumbent Jeffery Paine finished fourth with 148 votes.

TROY Cleanup at Former Manufactured Gas Plant Site

Action is about to begin that will address contamination related to the Niagara Mohawk (NM) Troy Water Street Manufactured Gas Plant (MGP) site, located at 8000 Main Street. The cleanup activities will be performed by National Grid with oversight provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). The activities are being phased to accommodate a natural gas line replacement project and are expected to take place over the next four years. The estimated cost to implement the remedy is \$35 million.

NEW LEBANON New Firehouse Proposed

At the May 10 regular meeting of the New Lebanon Town Council, Lebanon Valley Protective Association (LVPA) president Stephen Houghtling discussed the proposed plan for a new firehouse. Under the plan the LVPA would become centralized in one building instead of three. A local family has offered to match donations made for the new firehouse, dollar for dollar, until the end of 2022, up to an amount of \$250,000.

Shatford Park Fence

A proposal from Berkshire Fence Company for \$32,255, which is only slightly higher than the estimate the Town received last year, was approved. This bid includes installation of the new fence and removal and disposal of the old fence, as well as wiring on the back that will help prevent balls from rolling out into the road.

Skatepark

The current plan for the skatepark, which has been deemed salvageable, is to make the concrete slab underneath it the same size as a basketball court; that way once the skatepark is no longer there, the slab can be easily converted for other uses.

Shatford Park Splash Pad

The Council approved a motion to put construction of the new splash pad a Shatford Park out to bid. Bids are due at the Town Clerk's office by Friday, June 10 at 4 pm, with bids to be accepted or rejected at the June meeting.

Appointed or Elected

New Lebanon residents will have the option to decide if the Highway Supervisor position will remain elected, or become an appointed position. Should it become appointed, that would begin January 1 2024. A public hearing will be held on *June 14 at 6:55 pm*. Town Hall Streams

New Lebanon will increase its membership with Town Hall Streams to the \$250 a month unlimited package. This will allow all Town meetings to be streamed and recorded.

The East Nassau Board of Trustees meeting on the situation so a plan for relief could be devised. May 11 started with a public hearing and a plaque presentation. The Treasurer reported that the Village, at this point, has a nice cushion due to sales tax and strict monitoring by the Village Board. A new QuickBooks computer program has been purchased to keep the Village finances updated. An end-of-the-year meeting has been scheduled for May 31 at 7 pm at the Hoags Corner Ambulance Building. The public is welcome to attend.

Since the Village requirements for signage are restricted to 36 square feet, the Board denied the 48 square foot sign, and advised the owner to contact CITGO to get a smaller sign that would fall under the Village requirements. The owner said that he would be turning the lights off of the sign and pumps when the store is closed to avoid light pollution. Redistricting Opens Up Many Opportunities

Both the NYS Court of Appeals (the State's highest court) and a Federal Appeals court recently held that the new congressional and State Senate districts, as redrawn by the State Legislature, were in fact gerrymandered in favor of the Democratic party, and ordered a Special Master to redraw those lines. On Monday, May 16, those new districts were revealed and it set off a flurry of activity. One of the largest redraws involved Rensselaer County's congressional representation. Currently, most of the County falls within the

19th Congressional District, which is occupied by Representative Antonio Delgado, while the Troy area is in the 20th District, represented by long time incumbent Paul Tonko. Now, all of Rensselaer County moves into the 20th district. It would encompass the cities of Albany and Schenectady, but not Amsterdam, Congressman Tonko's place of residence.

That fact however, does not preclude Representative Tonko from seeking re-election in that district. New York State law says a congressional representative must only live in the state. If Mr. Tonko is re-elected, it is widely expected he would move into his new district.

Why not run in the district Amsterdam is moving into? Well that happens to be the 21st district, currently held by Representative Elise Stefanik, the number three Republican in Congress and a district that heavily favors Republicans. Mr. Tonko is a Democrat.

Republican Liz Joy is currently the party's pick to run in the 20th district. She was defeated by Representative Tonko two years ago. A State Supreme Court Judge has pushed the primary for Congress and the State Senate back to August and re-opened up the primary petitioning window. So, if someone wanted to challenge Ms. Joy in a primary they would have to start circulating their own nominating petitions, something that appears to be unlikely.

State Senate Seat Wide Open

The Master also made changes to the 43rd Senate District, currently represented by Daphne Jordan, a Saratoga County resident. The new district boundaries now include Rensselaer County, as well as portions of Albany and Washington counties, but no longer Saratoga

> County. While Ms. Jordan could still run in her old district while living outside of it once, she would have to re-locate for any future elections. At this point, it appears Senator Jordan will seek the Republican nomination to run in her new district. That opens up a race to replace her. One name has already come forward, that of 107th Assembly District representative Jake Ashby, who announced on Tuesday he would seek the GOP nomination. In his press release, Assemblyman Ashby said "after careful consideration and consulting with my family, friends and colleagues, I am honored to formally announce my candidacy for the 43rd New York State Senate District." Mr. Ashby is the current Assembly Republican Vice-Chairman and an Army combat veteran who has represented much of the new Senate District since taking office in April of 2018.

> He also says "I look forward to this exciting opportunity to continue serving our outstanding Capital District community and am committed to representing the people of Albany, Rensselaer and Washington Counties in our State Legislature." An interesting point here is that should Assemblyman Ashby have chosen instead to seek re-election, he would have been unopposed. Even more interesting now is that whoever the Committee to Name Replaces chooses to run for that seat instead will also be unopposed. The Assembly districts were not changed and will still have a June primary date, so it is too late for nominating petitions to be circulated for that race.

> Former Rensselaer County Executive candidate Andrea Smyth has already filed petitions for the Democratic line in the district, but since the primary opportunities have been reopened, she may face some opposition for that nod.

Difficulty Bringing Geo P's Carriage Home

John F and Irish Daniel worked to home, we drew manure onto Merrils carrot ground and John F. plowed it and Daniel worked filling up the ditch with stone a spell and this afternoon I beat manure to pieces in the meadow and old Mr. Perkins planted corn for Geo P.

Monday: I this forenoon drove back one of Geo P. young oxen onto my Rodgers farm, he got out and came home, and I put up some fence on said farm, and this afternoon I went onto said farm and put up twine to keep off crows from pulling up the corn. Today Geo P. took his carriage and carried Beriah Wylie to Canaan to take the cars for New York, and on the way home he left his carriage to J. H. Rich's to be repaired and varnished. Today the son of Ezekiel Knapp called and I paid him half a pound carrot seed for a recipe to make soap and is as follows: take 15 pounds of bar soap, 3 pounds salsoda, one fourth pound rosin, half pound salt, put the same in five gallons of soft water over a fire until dissolved, then put the same into a barrel and fill it up with cold water adding two ounces of spirits of turpentine and stir it up. This morning John Merrils came to lath and plaster overhead the kitchen and pre-

Friday, May 21, 1852: Today I and pare the mortar, by the job, one dollar and fifty cts, he only nailed on one lath and quit because he could not lath it alone, but promised to come again and do the job according to contract.

Tuesday: I this morning paid the Irishman Daniel his ten dollars for his month's work and he quit. Today Geo P. put up twine and other things in his corn field.

Wednesday: Today Mr. Tylor sent his colored man from Pittsfield and paid John F. for thirty eight bushels of potatoes at fifty cents per.

Thursday: I this afternoon returned to my Rodgers farm with three head of my cattle that came home and Wm B. Maxon helped me get back the young cattle that got in their lot.

Friday: This evening I went to Lebanon with one horse wagon and I called to James Henry Rich wagon shop and he tied Geo P. carriage to my wagon and I drew it nearly up the hill on the cross road below Charles Gillette's and the ropes broke and the carriage ran backwards down the hill. I then left my wagon and hitched to Geo P. carriage and came home. S. Owens rode a piece with me.

Saturday: I this morning early led my horse to Lebanon and got my wagon, I left last night on side of the road.
