SVMC Celebrates Graduates

Southwestern Vermont Medical Center (SVMC), part of Southwestern Vermont Health Care (SVHC), graduated eight nurses from its Transition-to-Practice Nurse Residency Program. The program is the first program in the state and one of only 208 in the United States to have received accreditation from the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Practice Transition Accreditation Program for nurses working in the medical-surgical, women's and children's and emergency departments. Accreditation for the intensive care unit is expected to be obtained later this year. Current students in the program joined the graduates in celebrating their completion.

The year-long program is completed during the students' first year of employment and as they serve in nursing roles across the organization. Monthly meetings connect RNs with nurse educators, leaders and skilled preceptors for mentorship. They incorporate clinical skills assessments and hone the interpersonal and organizational skills needed to coordinate care with a team of health care providers on the job.

US Supreme Court Strikes Down NYS Law on Concealed-Carry Permits

Case Initiated by Two Rensselaer County Residents

According to a majority of Justices, New York State's law that places strict limitations on who can carry a concealed weapon violated both the second and 14th amendment to the U.S. Constitution. The vote was 6 to 3 and represents the Court's conservative versus liberal ideological makeup. The decision finds in favor of Rensselaer County residents Robert Nash and Brandon Koch. The law they challenged generally prohibited concealed-carry permits unless the applicant could demonstrate a heightened risk that would necessitate the possession of a weapon outside of the home.

Writing for the majority, Justice Clarence Thomas concluded "that the plain text of the Second Amendment protects Koch's and Nash's proposed course of conduct carrying handguns publicly for self-defense. Nothing in the Second Amendment's text draws a home/public distinction with respect to the right to keep and bear arms, the definition of 'bear' naturally encompassing public carry. Moreover, the Second Amendment guarantees an individual right to possess and carry weapons in case of confrontation, and confrontation can surely take place outside of the home."

What They Are Saying

Reaction to the decision was swift, and basically split down political lines. New York Governor Kathy Hochul said "This decision isn't just reckless, it's reprehensible." She also claimed "It isn't what New Yorkers want." Governor Hochul indicated at a press conference the State would, in her words, "seek a leg-motion to the rank of staff sergeant.

islative fix to ameliorate its impact." To that effect, she has called a special session of the State Legislature for Thursday, June 30, to consider amendments to the State's current law.

Another lawmaker chastising the ruling was New York Senator Kirsten Gillibrand who called the ruling "not just irresponsible, it is downright dangerous."

There are those who support the ruling, one being 21st District Congresswomen Elise Stefanik who released a statement that says in part, "Today's Supreme Court ruling upholds the Constitutional rights of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms and correctly declares New York's shameful attempt to shred Second Amendment rights of New Yorkers unconstitutional.'

Ruling Has Major Impact

Primary Election Results

The Tuesday, June 28 primary election saw Democrats and current New York State Governor Kathy Hochul and Lt. Governor Antonio Delgado win their primaries, receiving 4,015 and 4,336 votes respectively. Lee Zeldin claimed 2,351 votes on the Republican Gubernatorial ballot, over 30% more than second place finisher Harry Wilson. The race for County Court Judge saw the same two names on the ballot for both the Conservative and Working Families Parties. Debra Young won the Conservative primary by a margin of 1,047 to 413 over George Burke III, while Burke defeated Young in the Primary for the Working Families Party by a margin of 438 to 272. These results are unofficial until they are certified by the County Board.

The following is an excerpt from Valedictorian Bailey Catlin's address to her classmates and the Berlin School Community as a whole:




A New Lebanon school bus enters the circular drive in front of the high school building, part of the post graduate parade for the NLCS seniors. Photo by Doug La Rocque.

A Thoughtful and Fond Farewell

In 1975 a popular television show debuted about a teacher in a tough New York City school, who was part of a special class there called "the warthogs." Against the odds, he went off to college and returned to teach his old class. The program of course was Welcome Back Kotter. While there are no warthogs in the New Lebanon School District, there is a similarity between the star of that program, Gabe Kaplan, and now retired New Lebanon Health and Physical Education instruction Len Brown.

Mr. Brown grew up in New Lebanon, attending its schools from start to finish, went off to college and returned to teach 40 years at his alma mater. Len was not only a teacher, but a very prominent member of the community, involved in its fire department, churches, children's sports and many fishing trips. The graduates asked him to be the keynote speaker at the ceremonies and like Kotter, he did not disappoint. Len made it clear that he was not the only one to take this journey: graduating high school, beginning the next portion of life, wherever it took him, only to find his way back home, and he encouraged his former students to keep their options open. They may end up in an entirely different part of the country or even the world. But to always

remember, New Lebanon is home, and like Kotter, they are always welcome back, for a visit or to stay.




Joyce C. Armstrong

The Life of George Holcomb

A Brisk Business in Potatoes

drove Geo P. oxen back onto my Rodgers farm to pasture, and I mended fence where the Scotchman's cow broke into my meadow, and salted my cattle and sheep. Irish John finished digging my early potatoes. Today John F. went to Pittsfield with 16½ bushels potatoes and sold them at one dollar per, which makes in all fifty four bushels potatoes he has sold for me, all at one dollar per bushel and for one half of them he paid me the cash and the other half I am to take the potatoes again 27 bushels, and this evening Geo P. starts for Albany with one horse load of 11 bushels, and Daniel Collins pays his own expenses and fetches half a ton plaster for Geo P. Saturday: I and John F. and Irish John drew stone off the ground in the young orchard where I had early potatoes and make a place to set the roots of garden strawberries. Today John Merrils came and mixed the mortar and plastered the job that is over head in my kitchen.

Friday, July 30, 1852: This forenoon I Henry Campbell went to Pool Hill to Parsons and carried four bushel potatoes for Geo P. at 75 cts per, and this afternoon he carried my two daughters to the widow Amy Moffitt's on a visit. This evening Geo P. and D. Collins returned from Albany. Today Briggs Eldridge called to my house and I told him I would subscribe for one share 25 dollars in a Union Store in Hancock Village.

Monday: I and Irish John and J. Runnals and Mrs Lynch dug potatoes for John F. Today John F. went to Pittsfield with one horse wagon and carried 16 bushel potatoes and sold them at one dollar per bushel.

Tuesday: Tonight old Mr. Aaron Merrils came and got or I paid one dollar and fifty cents cash that I owed his son for a job to lathe and plaster over head in my kitchen.

Wednesday: Today John F. went to Pittsfield with 16½ bushels of his potatoes and sold part for one dol per, and part of 75 cts per.
