2023 County Budget Proposed

Fifth Straight Year with Property Tax Reduction

From the Office of County Executive Steve McLaughlin

The proposed 2023 Rensselaer County budget number of County offices and funcwould include a 1 percent property tax reduction, making it the fifth consecutive year with such a reduction. When combined with the previous four years, property taxes will have been reduced by 20 percent under County Executive Steve McLaughlin.

'Under the 2023 budget, the County tax levy will decrease by 1 percent. While modest, when coupled with the previous tax reductions from the past four years, it will mean our taxes have decreased by onefifth in just five years. A 20 percent reduction in taxes is, we believe, is not equaled by any County in the State, and shows Rensselaer County is a leader in protecting taxpayers and encouraging other development," added McLaughlin.

McLaughlin noted the County's strong performance in sales tax, which has continued to be healthy in recent months. For 2023, the County estimates sales tax at \$102.5 million.

The budget also incorporates the Reimagine Rensselaer County project, including the purchase of 99 Troy Road in East Greenbush, which will house a

tions. The Reimagine project will see the County owning a larger percentage of buildings housing Rensselaer County services than at any time in its history.

"Along with providing more control and stability for the County over our facilities, there will be a longterm positive impact on County finances. The lease for Social Services and other functions cost the County approximately \$12 million

over the life of the agreement. At the end of that \$12 million, there is no equity, no ownership, and no control over future operations," said McLaughlin.

McLaughlin also criticized the series of criminal justice reforms, including bail reform and raising the age provisions.

"To date, by our estimates, by the end of the 2023 fiscal year, the County will have paid nearly \$1 million in taxpayer funds for criminal justice reforms, which

is unfair on multiple levels," added McLaughlin.

There will also be a continued focus on improving County roads, with another 35 miles on track to be paved.





Board of Education Highlights

During the Tuesday, October 18 regular meeting of the Berlin Central School District Board of Education, Superintendent Joseph Dhara stated that the district has signed up to participate in the STOPit solutions program, which will provide anonymous incident reporting via mobile app, the web, and phone hotline. Mr. Dhara also announced that the key fobs and security cameras have been installed throughout the district.

Middle/High School Principle Kimberly Brownell stated she will meet with the Stephentown Library in hopes of collaborating with them on an after school program such as the current after school tutoring program offered by the Grafton Community Library.

During the public comment portion of the meeting, several members of the community, including a teacher, discussed concerns over the workload that district teachers have had to take on over the last few years. Those who spoke felt the extra work came from positions that had been vacated, not being filled, adding more responsibility to current teachers and administrators

Town Board Highlights

Board had some enthusiastic conversations about several plans and events throughout the Town ranging from employment, budget, and building projects.

Supervisor Murray reported that November's meeting would have several presentations about PFOA, and she encouraged residents to attend if they wished to learn more. She noted that, presently, the Town Clerk does not have access to the town's Facebook page but that they are working on getting her access. This way, she can download information for residents to use. The Town Board discussed the Town audit. Murray thanked the Town Clerk for assisting by pulling data. She hopes to get information on the website after the Board has had time to read it. Still, she wanted everyone to know that all the recommendations for record-keeping and the approval process for dispersing funds now are being addressed.

The Planning Board received approval for the retaining of a floodplain map in the form of a digital version provided by Community Planning and Environmental Associates for \$720. The map will use the 1978 Firm Flood data and the 2018 Flood Risk Report for the Hudson-Hoosic watershed from FEMA.

> The Historian reported that the 1991 time capsule was accidentally dug up during repair work in front of the library. He discovered that the container was damaged. Once a new container is purchased, a new location for the time capsule will need to be found. He also touched on the need for the preservation of Town records. The historical society hopes to purchase a new scanner, laptop, and copier that will be placed at the library.

> The Building Committee is in the process of getting a roof quote for the Town Hall and two decks for PVMCC and the library. The Town has received three quotes for a generator, and they are waiting on a quote for a gas line for the generator. There was some discussion on how to paint the lines in the parking lot of the PVMCC to make the entranceway safer for wheelchair accessibility, but more research from the State is needed to make a final decision.

> The ambulance will be getting a facelift by changing the cab. The ambulance is presently working on a grant to attempt to add a lift system.

> The Highway Department is trying to get two oncall seasonal part-time employees and one full-time, seasonal employee to assist with snow removal. The Board plans to advertise for the positions and hopes to make a final decision by November 21. The Board felt that having a CDL license would be preferred but not required. The budget calendar was finalized, with the Town Board setting two budget workshops for October 24 and 26, at 6:30 pm, and a public hearing was set up for November 7, at 7 pm. The budget adoption special meeting date will be November 14, at 7 pm. The budget has to be finished by November 20.

focused on many community-driven activities.

After the public hearing on the solar moratorium, the Board paid the minutes and bills. The presenter mentioned during the transfer station report that the paint care program has been running smoothly. Four new paint can storage containers have been placed at the station; however, the goal will be to reduce down to two storage containers. In the future, there will be some examination of how to increase revenue at the transfer station.

Resolutions about fall cleanup bids and extending service between the Eastern Rensselaer County Solid Waste Management Authority and the Town of Stephentown were approved. The approval of the resolution for the solar moratorium will involve the construction of new commercial solar energy facilities. The Town has assembled a committee of Board members and residents with engineering and construction experience. The committee's purpose will be to have site visits and examine the impact of laws on commercial solar projects in the Town.

The Town received a letter from the New York State Department of Transportation in response to an August 12, 2020 Town request to attain speed limit signs for some of the Town roads that have been

The October 17 meeting of the Stephentown Board approved. The signs are now a step forward with a speed limit to enforce. Andrews Lane between County Route 27-28 has been approved for 35 mph; Losty Road between Presbyterian Hill and Sutherland for 40 mph; Tom Titus Road between Route 27-Wemple will be 35; and Sutherland Road between County Route 26 and Route 43 will be 40 mph. The goal over the next few months will be to prepare to enforce the limit in Town.

> A veterans day celebration has been set for Saturday, November 12, at 11 am in the park. Coffee and doughnuts will be served after the celebration. The library was happy to report that they plan on a Town Halloween celebration on October 29 from 2 to 4 pm. At 3 pm, there will be a costume contest, and at 4 pm, it will conclude with a trunk or treat. They also plan to have their annual Jack-O'-Lantern display. Residents are asked to bring their carved pumpkins back the day before Halloween.

> Finally, the Board finalized the budget information. The Board disclosed that they have successfully constructed a budget under the two percent tax cap. A special Town Board meeting on the budget for November 14, at 7 pm has been scheduled. The budget will need to be finalized by November 20.

North Troy Solar Gains Planners' Approval

Renewals submitted its site plan application to construct a commercial solar collector on land off Oakwood Avenue and Farrell Road. First proposed over the former landfill, the plan was rejected by the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). Atlas then redrew the plan so it sits adjacent to the landfill, with only the connecting poles to the National Grid lines over the questionable land. That gained DEC's blessing.

The Planning Board and the general public had questions about visibility, noise, water runoff, and decommissioning once the facility's life expectancy expired. On Thursday, October 20, all the questions had been answered to the Board's satisfaction and final approval was given.

Solar Moratorium

This may well be the last solar facility to gain Planning Board approval for sometime as the Town Board just one week earlier introduced a local law to place a one-year moratorium on all commercial solar until potential siting locations can be reviewed. A public hearing on the proposed law and possible vote are scheduled for November.

Settling an Encroachment Issue

It has been the better part of a year since Atlas to move forward with a three lot subdivision on Springbrook Landing Boulevard. The problem was a current driveway actually encroaching on land that was part of the subdivision. Without the proper legal framework in place to deal with the issue, if it was to become an issue in the future, the Board was reluctant to place the Town in the middle of such a dispute. A revocable agreement between the two parties has been signed and the project can now move forward. A public hearing was scheduled for the Board's November 17 meeting.

Not Ready Yet

Paulsen Development's request to construct a twostory medical office and surgical center building on McChesney Avenue near the entrance to Market 32 was not ready to proceed and the matter was adjourned until their next meeting.

Working alongside the Department of Environmental Conservation, shoppers will find clearly designated disposal bins located in the Tops pharmacy department where they can dispose of their unused and unwanted medications.

The last National Drug Take Back day, hosted in April 2022, saw over 721,093 pounds, or 360 tons of medication recovered. Since the program's inception in 2010, 15.9 million pounds of medication across the US have been properly disposed of.

Returning prescription drugs at any one of the 50 Tops Friendly Markets locations can be done safely and anonymously year round during normal pharmacy hours.





Two Months Pay for a Suit

Friday, February 18, 1853: I took the one horse wagon and carried my daughter Charlotte E. to Lebanon to Doctor Right's and paid him 12 cents for pulling a tooth for her. We then called to Nichols store and post office and paid one cent for what is called a valentine letter. Today John F. rode his horse to Pittsfield on a visit and stayed, and tonight Geo P. returned home from Lenox and his wife with him.

Tuesday: I am lame, I only tended to a few chores and Patrick Rafter did the chores and worked to the wood pile. John did chores and this evening he went to Hancock village to the basement of the Church to an oyster supper and paid 50 cts, and today Geo P. walked and drove a yoke fat oxen to the


west part of New Lebanon to Mr. Milo Bull and said Bull paid Geo P. one hundred and twelve dollars for said oxen. Friday: Today John F. and Patrick Rafter went onto my Rodgers farm, they drove seven head cattle to the barn to be foddered and stabled, and Patrick went to the saw mill once with two logs

Saturday: Today Geo P. took my one horse wagon and his horse and carried his wife home to her Father's in Lenox. Tonight I paid Patrick Rafter ten dollars in cash which pays him for two months work from the twenty first of Jany last. Tonight said Patrick paid out nine dollars and a half for a suit of clothes and cloth for a shirt to N. Nichols store.
